2017 was a very eventful and a particularly fruitful year for us here at RENEW.

2017 began very eventfully with the Film Festival for the Young People as a kick-start event to mark the International Women's Day. About 8 short films were selected to enter the film festival under the three themes of:

- 1. Sexual Reproductive Health and Rights
- 2. Gender Equality
- 3. Women Empowerment

The winning film makers were awarded cash prizes during the International Women's Day celebrations on 8th March at Terma Linca which was graced by our beloved President Gyalyum Sangay Choden Wangchuck.

The High Level Advocacy on "Priority Public Health and Social Issues" led by our President, which began in 2016 continued on in the 14 Dzongkhags and met about 37,292 students, teachers, civil servants, businessmen, public from the gewogs and people from vulnerable groups. Among many other issues, the advocacy focused on the growing social concerns of suicide, teenage pregnancy, substance abuse, lifestyle diseases, HIV/AIDs and Domestic Violence. By the end of the tour of the 20 Dzongkhags, voluntary networks of MSTF-CBSS was strengthened with proper M&E mechanisms in place supported from MoH and the 20 Dzongdags.

The expansion of DAISAN network was completed in 20 Dzongkhags following the High Level Advocacy,

and the Child Protection Capacity was enhanced among the CBSS Volunteers.

A major achievement was the publication of a booklet on "Dissemination of Social Messages in Local and National Festivals" in collaboration with Dratshang Lhentshog and RAPA. Henceforth, most mask dances in the Tshechus will be explained with some relevant social messages. The book was launched by His Holiness the 70th Je Khenpo Trulku Jigme Choedra at the Buddha Point on 6th October, 2017.

The first batch of 147 counselors from across the country was certified by RENEW-BBCC supported by NBCC. This begins the journey of the counselors as recognized professionals in Bhutan.

A day that will be marked in the history of RENEW was the International Day for Elimination of Violence Against Women-25th Nov. 2017 when those volunteers who served for more than 10 years were awarded recognition and appreciation certificates. The first exhibition on products from recycled paper and textile at the event was graced by the Australian High Commissioner HE Harinder Kaur Sidhu.

As a recommendation from the 3 day National Symposium in 2016, work began in 2017 on the Consensus Building Initiative in collaboration with the JSW School of Law and BNLI.

All in all, it has been a year when volunteerism was strengthened, new networks forged and new roads paved for the future.



The dissemination will be carried out for cultural officers in all the 20 Dzongkhags. The messages will be translated into English for the benefit of school students across the country.





Advocacy on health priorities and social issues resumed in 8 districts viz Samtse, Chukkha, S/jongkhar, Pemagatshel, Tashigang, Trshiyangtse, Mongar and, Lhuntse) from 9th April to 27th April 2017. The advocacy was led by Her Majesty Gyalyum Sangay Choden Wangchuck, the Founder and President of RENEW, also UNFPA Goodwill Ambassador for Bhutan. It was organized jointly by Ministry of Health and RENEW with support from WHO, UNFPA and UNICEF. The team was also joined by National Commission for Women and Children and Ministry of Education.


a) Sensitization on Health priorities and Social issues to community including school faculties and students.

Rallying with the public

The team reached 15,246 people from different sectors in 8. Around 6556 students, principals and teachers from 16 Middle Secondary Schools and Higher Secondary Schools attended the advocacy. The schools that participated during the advocacy were Samdrup Jongkhar Middle Secondary School, Garpawoong Middle Secondary School and Dungsum Academy from Samdrup Jongkhar Dzongkhag; Nangkhor Central School from Pemagatshel Dzongkhag; Mongar Higher Secondary School and Sherab Reldri from Mongar Dzongkhag; Rangjung Central School from Trashigang Dzongkhag; Baylling Central School, Tshenkharla Central School, Kuenzangling Central School, Ramjar Middle Secondary School and Zorig Choesum from Trashi Yangtse Dzongkhag and Lhuentse Higher Secondary School, Minji Middle Secondary School, Autsho Central School and Tangmachu Central School from Lhuentse Dzongkhag.

It also includes students from Samtse College of Education in Samtse Dzongkhag, College of Science of Science and Technology in Phuentsholing Dungkhag, Gaedu College of Business Studies in Chukha Dzongkhag, Zorig Institution in Trashi Yangtse Dzongkhag, Sherubtse College in Trashigang Dzongkhag, Jigme Namgyal Polytechnic in Samdrup Jongkhar Dzongkhag and Bunu Vocational Training Institute also attended the advocacy.

1000 army and police officials and their families in Samtse and Samdrup Jongkhar Dzongkhags attended the High Level Advocacy. Around 100 employees of Drayangs, Spa, Massage Parlour and Bar owners, truck and taxi trivers also attended the awareness program. Around 6333 people including sector heads and officials, religious figures, local leaders, legal officials and MSTF-CBSS constituted the public.

Highlight of the activity

Special meetings with MSTF-CBSS members were conducted whereby the Member Secretary and Thrizin presented on the progress, challenges and way forward. It was worth nothing that planned activities were incorporated to address priority social issues in the 12 FYP and there was commitment from Dzongdags to ensure the sustainability of the program in their respective Dzongkhags. Monitoring and evaluation will be done jointly by MoH and RENEW.



Advocacy to western region (Haa, Paro, Wangdi, Punakha, Gasa & Thimphu) continued from 3rd Nov 2017 and completed on 28th December 2017. The team reached 17,192 people from different sectors.

Rallying with the Public

The team reached 550 people in Haa Dzongkhag that included local leaders from 6 Gewogs, and Thromdes, Village Health Workers, regional heads and staffs, Royal Bhutan Police personnel, Rabdhey, Dzongkhag Adminstration and general public. An additional 530 Royal Bhutan Army family members in Damthang were reached.

877 students and 100 teachers from Jamphel Higher Secondary School, Chundu Armed Force and public schools also attended the advocacy. Parallel meeting with Principals, School Health Coordinators/Counselors was held separately.

The team reached approximately 800 people in Paro which included Dzongkhag Administration, Rabdhey, District Court, RBA, Thromde, regional heads and staffs, Armed forces, Local Leaders from 10 Gewogs, general public, GAOs, Village Health Workers. MSTF/CBSS Members and DAISAN members performed short skit on Sexual Abuse.

The team visited Drugyel Higher Secondary School and interacted with 600 students from Drugyel Central School, Shari Higher Secondary School, Tenzin Higher Secondary School, Yoezerling Higher Secondary School and Utpal Academy.

A parallel meeting with Principals, School Health Coordinators/Counselors was held. 70 representatives from 18 schools of Paro, namely, Drugyel Higher Secondary School, Shari Higher Secondary School, Tenzin Higher Secondary School, Yoezerling Higher Secondary School, Utpal Academy, Wanakha Central School, Lango Middle Secondary School, Khangkhu Middle Secondary School, Shaba

Middle Secondary School, Bitekha Middle Secondary School, Dawakha Lower Secondary School, Dotey Lower Secondary School, Gaupey Lower Secondary School, Wochu Lower Secondary School, Shaba Primary School, Taju Primary School, Olathang Primary School, Ramchetsekha Primary Schools, & Deputy Education Officers attended the meeting.

The team visited Paro College of Education and Staff, 68 staff and 232 students attended the advocacy program. A parallel meeting was conducted for staff presided over by Her Majesty. The team reached approximately 600 RBA family members in Shaba.

In Punakha Dzongkhag, 700 members including students, principal, vice principal and teachers of Punakha Central School, principals, school Health Coordinators and Counsellors of Dashiding

Autonomous School, Dechentsemo Central School, Ugyen Academy, Khuruthang Middle Secondary School, Kabesa Middle Secondary School and Tashidingkha Central School, Lam Neten, Dzongdag, Drangpon, Doctor, DHO, and the OC attended the meeting. The team also visited Technical Training Institute in Khuruthang where they met 150 students and staff. 1000 people including Dzongdag, Drangpon, SSP, Dzongrab, DT Thrizin, Regional Heads and staffs, Armed Forces, Sector Heads, Gups of 11 Gewogs and Punakha Thromde, General Public, GAOs, Village Health Workers, MSTF-CBSS members also attended the meetings.

In Wangdue Phodrang Dzongkhag and 1000 people gathered at MTC, Tencholing ground and was attended by Dzongdag, Lam Neten, Drangpon, Commandant RBA(MTC and Wing XII), SP RBP, Thrizin, Leaders from Gewogs, Communities/General Public, GAOs, Village Health Workers, MSTF-CBSS members.

690 students and staff from Bajo Higher Secondary School, Gaselo Central School, Samtengang Central School have been recorded to have attended the meeting. Dzongdag, Drangpon, Dzongrab, SSP, Nyiso Gup, Principal and School staff were among the crowd.

The team reached 900 members of RBA family and Dzongdag, Lam Neten, Gupda MTC, Drangpon, Commandant MTC, SP RBP, GAOs MSTF & CBSS Members.

In Gasa Dzongkhag, the team reached 200 people including students, principal and staffs. DEO, Dzongdag, Drangpon, SSP and RBA were also among the crowd. Another 100 people in Gasa attended the advocacy.

The High Level Advocacy ended in Thimphu Dzongkhag on December 28, 2017. The public meeting gathered 3500 people from Gewogs, Thimphu Thromde, Road Safety & Transport Authority and community. Advocacy was also carried out with the 4300 RBG, RBA &RBP family members.

Highlight of the Activity

The Haa MSTF-CBSS members reviewed their past programs and presented way forward for 12th FYP. 70 members including Dzongdag, Drangpon. Lam Netan, Gups, Throm Thuemi, MSTF-CBSS members, SP & the RBG Commandant attended the meeting.

The Paro MSTF-CBSS Meeting was attended by 60 members including Dzongdag, Drangpon, Lam Neten, SSP, Commander, Gups, Throm Thuemi, MSTF-CBSS members, GAOs, MSTF-CBSS meeting at Punakha Dzongkhag with 75 members included Dzongdag, Drangpon, SSP, Dzongrab, DT Thrizin, Regional Heads and staffs, Armed Forces, Sector Heads, Gups of 11 gewogs and Punakha Thromde, Communities/General Public, GAOs, Village Health Workers and MSTF-CBSS members.

In Wangdue Phodrang Dzongkhag, MSTF- CBSS meeting was held with 130 members comprising of Dzongdag, Lam Neten, Drangpon, Commandant MTC, SP RBP, GAOs, and MSTF & CBSS Members.

MSTF-CBSS Gasa meeting was organized 100 members including Dzongdag, Drangpon, Lam Neten, DT Thrizin, GAOs, Gups and MSTF-CBSS members.

MSTF-CBSS meeting was conducted with 120 members in Thimphu.

Outcome of the High level advocacy

The advocacy was very successful as it brought together all the key stakeholders to address health and social priorities. It enabled involvement of community people, students, teachers, service providers (Judiciary, Health, CSO, education sector, Armed Forces) in the dialogue to address the issues. The following are the achievement of the High level Advocacy:

- 1. All capacity building needs of the volunteers to be identified, technical expert agency identified and the required budget to be reflected in the 12FYP. This will not only ensure that the budget is secured for capacity building and the technical expertise sought from relevant agencies, but it will also ensure that both MoH and RENEW can plan for specialized trainings and secure technical expertise needed in different Dzongkhags.
- 2. MSTF- RENEW CBSS Service Centres to be built in each Dzongkhag except for Trashigang, Bumthang and Chukha where Regional Gawailing/ Happy Homes may be established. So the Dzongkhags will identify land that is easily accessible by the communities, register and have the MSTF-RENEW CBSS Service Centres built within the 12FYP. A standard diagram may be shared by RENEW Headquarters if required, however, the Dzongkhags have the flexibility to build specific designs as long as the requirement are met.
- 3. The Dzongkhags to ensure that the MSTF-RENEW CBSS activities are reflected in the Dzongkhag APA and submit timely report to MoH
- The members of network is to be revamped by including more local people, affected community representatives and the Member Secretary has to be elected. The DHO is not to be a de facto member Secretary.
- 5. Basic Counselling Skills/Mental Health Facilitation training for the volunteers has been identified as the most common request in all the Dzongkhags.









Health Facilitators Training

he Mental Health Facilitators (MHF)
Training was held from July 25 to July
28, 2017 at Kelki High School, Thimphu.
The MHF training is a mandatory and
prerequisite to National Certified Counsellors
(NCC). A total of 147 counselors from Ministry of
Education, Government Autonomous Bodies, Civil
Society Organizations (CSOs) and private education
consultancy firms were trained.

The training was simultaneously conducted by 12 Master MHF Trainers in four different classrooms. Prior to the training, the counselors around the country registered themselves with Bhutan Board for Certified Counselors (BBCC). This is 30 hours a

training and all counselors will have to undergo this MHF training to fulfill the requirement to become National Certified Counselors (NCC). The right to use training manual has been granted by NBCC, US to BBCC and BBCC alone can provide this training in Bhutan

The main objective of the training was to allow everyone to be at the same level and have basic understanding of psychosocial issues and problems, and to be able to recognize, intervene, and refer. However, MHF Training does not qualify an individual to become a counselor.

What ID Mental Health Facilitators (MHF) training?

The MHF training was designed to improve access to mental health care within a given community by educating and training professionals, para-professionals and lay people in the basics of mental health. The intent is not to create a new mental health profession, but rather to provide individuals with the tools and skills necessary to identify mental health needs, make referrals, and work with and support those in need of mental health care.

The training included different topics, such as, a basic structure for teaching, helping skills, working with integrity, diversity awareness, suicide prevention, trauma response, and referral and consultation techniques. The participants were not just trained on the mental health issues but they were also provided with listening and communicating skills in order to help them offer support and better determine if an individual may require professional mental health care.

Using the MHF's guidelines, the participants are able to learn to identify and respond to cases of dementia, alcohol and drug abuse, domestic violence and depression. The facilitators are not mental health workers but are first responders to help with problemsolving and to make referrals.



The MHF training will be an annual feature for anyone aspiring to become National Certified Counselor without which a counselor cannot practice counseling in the country. BBCC-RENEW shall continue to professionalize, train and certify counselors henceforth.

4TH Biennial BHUTAN COUNSELING CONFERENCE

"Pontinuing Aucation, Supervision, Pertification, Training"

Conference was organized by BBCC-RENEW in collaboration with National Board for Certified Counselors (NBCC), USA and UNICEF. The conference was held on September 28 and September 29, 2017 at Namgay Heritage Hotel, Thimphu. The theme of the conference was "Counselor Education, Supervision, Training and Certification". This conference was organized with the main objective of creating a platform for counselors to discuss and exchange ideas, upgrade their professional knowledge and develop ethical standards for counseling.

Her Royal Highness Gyalsem Kesang Choden Wangchuck graced the opening ceremony and officially launched the BBCC website and guidelines for the National Certification of Counseling professionals in Bhutan. Bhutan Board for Certified Counselors (BBCC) certified 147 counselors for the first time in four different categories based on their qualification and the level of training. The certification of NCC (P) - Peer counselor, NCC (A) -Associate Counselor, NCC (M) - were 4 categories. Counselor and NCC(S) – Supervisor were done. Apart from the counselors, a total of about 200 guests including experts from National Board for Certified Counselor (NBCC) USA attended the conference.

The speakers were all qualified and experienced individuals who are leaders in the fields of counseling, mental health and psychotherapy. On the first day, the conference focused on how Bhutan is entering a global movement with local emphasis. Counseling

can be a profession that respects the culture and traditions within all countries. As we help counseling expand globally, we have the responsibility to seek the wisdom of local populations in order to ensure the best counseling services for the region and to help the world find ways dealing with our mental health needs.

The participants were also introduced to the Counseling Education and Supervision in the US, including benefits and how this can be adapted in our culture to help counselors' professional development. A brief presentation on the Counseling Institutes in the USA was highlighted. The purpose and process of global counseling institutes were also explained to the audience. The presenter Dr. Scott had co-led counseling outreach in numerous countries and has been involved in international counseling efforts for decades.

A session on self-care and wellness focused on the steps a counselor can take to care for themselves as they care for their clients. The presenter also shared practical advice to counselors to help them stay well and healthy. Information about burnout and vicarious trauma were also covered. According to the speaker, burnout occurs when counselors lose enthusiasm for their work because of stress. Vicarious trauma occurs when counselors are traumatized as a result of hearing about the trauma their clients have experienced.

Counseling from a Buddhist perspectives were presented which gave the participants an insight

into how spirituality can be mixed during counseling that helps the client to grow holistically, as well as help counselors to understand the clients living in a Buddhist country.

On the September 29, 2017 the participants had an opportunity to opt and hear about the School Counseling; Mental Health; Domestic Violence and Child Abuse; Promoting Systemic Change: Approaches and Techniques for Working with Couples and Families Impacted by Addictions; and Peoples First Language: Communicating with Individuals with Disabilities. The sessions were carried out simultaneously in five different rooms by the speakers from the U.S., Norway, Poland, Singapore and Bhutan.

The Mental Health Counseling equipped the participants to basic principles in treatment of trauma related disorders and made them understand the need for assessment of medication for depressive symptoms and how to collaborate in prevention, detection and treatment of mental disorders.

The session on Domestic Violence and Child Abuse addressed the problem of adverse childhood experience. The presenter examined how it can influence human development and lead to trauma related disorders. The participants were able to understand the effects of trauma, recognize typical post traumatic symptoms, be aware of culture-specific factors affecting illness, behavior and help seeking.

In another session, the participants were able to learn through case studies how to provide counseling services to couples and families who are challenged by a family member who has an addiction problem. The presenter also provided information on how counselors, through the language they use can communicate and respect for their clients who have disabilities. The participants also learned how to address their client as individuals and avoid categorizing them according to their disabilities.

Bach systems remedy was introduced to the counseling professionals of Bhutan. The Bach flower remedy is known throughout the world as a safe and effective form of complementary therapy for emotional balance for over 80 years.

"There is no one, where ever we may be on the earth who does not listen to music" is how Mr. Jigme Drukpa introduced to the closing of conference. He got introduced to singing by his grandmother when he was a child. According to him, there is no winner or a loser in music like any other competitions. Both listener and the musician are the winners.

The conference will be held biennially where the counselors will need to recertify the certification every three years, which will require them to fulfill certain criteria such as counselor education, supervised experience and practicing.

asic tailoring courses to 15 women at RENEW Center in Thimphu, which started in 2017, will be completed in 2018.

The training program aims at capacity building and also focuses on the advancement of the entrepreneurship of the trainees. The project started with small financial and human resources and a very limited number of trainees.

It has expanded gradually covering more beneficiary groups; from victims of Domestic Violence and Gender Based Violence to other vulnerable women/

youth groups like widows, single mothers, school drop-outs and women with disabilities.

In 2017 the common practice has been to provide the ginger candy training to all the women participating any skills training courses in RENEW Center.

With the support from Australian Himalayan Foundation (AHF), the livelihood skills training in RENEW has been intensified with the introduction of Assamese looms. The fabrics for the tailoring is being produced by weavers at Gawailing Happy Home. The Vocational Training Center in Gawailing Happy Home was inaugurated in August 2017.

A one day program/training/workshop on Gender Based Violence and Sexual Reproductive Health was held on 16 January 2017 at RENEW conference hall for 48 women working in various Thimphu camp sites under Public Work Department (PWD), Ministry of Works & Human Settlement. Similarly, one day workshop was held on 31 January 2017 at Gawailing Happy Home for 64 female community members from different villages of Mewong Gewog and Gawailing livelihood trainees.

RENEW covered topics on **Domestic Violence/Gender Based Violence, Sexual Abuse and Sexual Reproductive Health.** Dr. Ugyen Tshomo, Gynecologist from JDWNR Hospital was invited to deliver talk on reproductive health, sexual health, cervical cancer, breast cancer, family Planning, antenatal/postnatal care, UTI, HIV/STI and other issues. Towards the end of the workshop, a voluntary testing camp was also organized in collaboration with HISC, MOH for the women on HIV, Syphilis and Hepatitis. This workshop has been successful with fund support from IPPF.

one day program/ training/workshop on Family Planning, Contraception, and Sexually-Transmitted Infections was held on 8th May 2017, to celebrate IPPF's Global Day of Action week from 8th to 14th May. The program was conducted as a part of IPPF's "I Decide" campaign centered the theme "Universal and Equitable

Access to Family Planning for Women and Girls Everywhere".

The program was attended by more than 40 RENEW, RENEW-Microfinance Project, FIDA Project staff and trainees at RENEW Centre and it was conducted with the aims of increasing access to SRHR to address inequality and reducing unmet need for family planning services. RENEW emphasized on the self empowerment, so that one can make one's own decision to access services that is already in place.



Enhancing Child Protection and Participation

ith the support from NICEF, RENEW and Youth Development Fund (YDF) jointly organized roll out trainings on **Child Protection** and participation in 7 Dzongkhags in Trashigang, Wangduephodrang, Samdrupjongkhar, Tsirang, Lhuentse, Paro and Haa from 7th September, 2017 to 27th November 2017 for DAISAN and YVIA members of the Dzongkhags.

The main objectives of the training was to build capacity of the young people to prevent Violence Against Children in the community; building solid foundation in understanding at a conceptual level of child rights, child protection, children's participation and violence; preparing children with skills and methods to keep safe and conduct themselves responsibly. The training covered the purpose of the Convention on Rights of Child (CRC) and acquainted them with the categories of

rights, i.e. survival, development, protection and participation. The youth related issues in Bhutan were highlighted followed by intensive discussion among the participants. The deliberation continued with the introduction to legal provisions for protection of children.

The discussions also touched the positive and negative childhood experiences that would determine the growth trajectories of the individuals.




4. Training of CBSS volunteers & DAISAN coordinators on Child Protection and Child Rights








- Engage monastic institutions in taking the message to the unreached are as they are highly respected in the community and therefore strong agent of change;
- Target youth in the monastic institutions.

Outcome of the workshop:

The strongly recommended and committed to provide the training workshop to teachers & participants of monastic institutions so that the messages on social priorities will trickle down to youth in their institutes and the community they are living in.

They will encourage making the LSE a part of their curriculum in the monastic institutes.

They are committed to strengthen partnership with RENEW in up scaling advocacy and awareness programs during annual prayers and festivals.

Training on Bach Flower Remedy Healing System

The level 1 course training on Bach Flower Remedy Healing System for 1st batch was held on the 17th and 18th July 2017 for 25 counseling professionals by Ms. Deki Soh and Ong Hong Seng from Singapore. Both of them are Bach Foundation registered practitioners (UK). The Bach Flower Remedy is a therapeutic approach to help depression, grief, loss, nervousness, self-esteem, despair, fear, uncertainty, sensitivity and loneliness. The Bach Flower Remedies work in conjunction with herbs, homeopathy and medications and are safe for everyone, including children, pregnant women, pets, elderly and even plants.

The purpose of the training is to provide the skills to use the system to balance the emotion, which in turn translates to the ability to support oneself, as well as providing for those requiring emotional support.

Awareness Program in Chumey Gewog

The people were also informed about the services RENEW provides and harmful consequences of DV/GBV and substance abuse. The program was organized with the help of Dzongkhag heath sector of Bumthang.











Awarenesss Program in Lhuentse

A two day workshop was organiszed for 36 principals, Counselors and school coordinators from 16 schools in Lhuentse. The workshop covered sessions on Domestic Violence, Sexual Gender Based Violence, Sexual Reproductive Health, adolescent health, legal polices & laws, police crime & interventions, HeForShe campaign, substance abuse and other adolescent related issues. The program was financially supported by UNDP.

Consultative workshop on consensus building initiative (CBI)

18 core RENEW CBSS members gather at Paro for a week long consultative workshop from 11-15 September 2017 to come up with the consensus building program. The consultant from Jigme Singye Law school , Mr. Stephan presented on the role an active CBSS volunteer can play in strengthening and clarifying the inter relationship between Bhutan's formal and informal sectors with regard to issues of Domestic Violence. Following the Domestic Violence Prevention Act 2013 (DVPA), Domestic Violence is a crime therefore cannot be negotiated. As a consensus builder, a volunteer can provide immediate assistance and advice to the client by providing relevant resources or protective strategies, rudimentary information about the various formal and informal dispute resolution mechanism available. The workshop was conducted with active volunteers in the field for their practical experiences and input to work further on the program. The model that will be adopted will have to make use of Article 22 of DVPA which specially authorizes the Royal Bhutan Police (RBP) to allow "lesser" forms of Domestic Violence to be "settled mutually". RENEW will have to collaborate with RBP in order to comply with the Act. The project is supported by UNDP, country office Bhutan.
